BEACH INFORMATION

BEACH TAGS

The Borough of Avalon allows for the sale of seasonal beach tags at preseason prices. The beach tags are available either by stopping by the Avalon Tax Collector's Office at Avalon Borough Hall, or through the mail. Mail orders (with a self-addressed stamped envelope) and in-person purchases will begin on March 1, 2018. Seasonal beach tags are available at the preseason rate of \$23 through May 31; on June 1, the price of a seasonal beach tag increases to \$28 for the balance of the season. Cash or checks will be accepted until May 11.

Avalon now offers seasonal beach tag sales from your smartphone!

The Borough of Avalon has partnered with Viplly to provide another way for residents and visitors to purchase seasonal beach tags for the upcoming summer season. The seasonal beach tags are available via mobile app for smartphones for both Apple and Android devices.



Individuals who are interested in reserving seasonal beach tags can simply download the mobile app, purchase the requested number of seasonal beach tags, and pick up the actual beach tags upon their visit to Avalon from any beach tag checkers or at the Avalon Beach Tag Booth located at 30th Street and Avalon Avenue, which opens March 31. To redeem the tag, the customer presses "scan now" in the Viplly app and points the camera at the QR code displayed by the beach tag checker or at the booth. The phone will then display how many beach tags were purchased and the tags will be handed to the customer.

All sales are final, and no refunds will be offered; a small service fee will be applied for each transaction. The seasonal beach tags are \$23 through May 31 and \$28 thereafter. Beach tags may be purchased via the Viplly app any time now through the end of the season. Individuals may view the Viplly Pass Avalon Beach Tag app at www.vipliespass.com/avalonbeach-tags/.

The Avalon Beach Tag Booth will be open weekends starting on March 31 from 10am through 4pm; the booth opens for the season daily starting on April 28. Beach tags are required for all individuals 12 years or older between the hours of 10am until 5pm from May 28 through Sept. 3. Daily and weekly tags will be available starting May 28; daily tags cost \$6, and weekly tags costs \$12.

Avalon is proud to offer free seasonal beach tags to all veterans of the United States Armed Forces. Active duty military members and their immediate families also may enjoy the beaches without buying a beach tag.

BEACH INFORMATION

PROTECTED BEACHES

For your protection, bathing and swimming are permitted only at protected beaches where lifeguards are on duty 10am to 5pm, June 9-Aug. 19. From May 26-June 8 and Aug. 20-Sept. 3, a limited number of lifeguards will be assigned to one or more designated beaches as available personnel permits. Use of rafts and surfboards is permitted only at designated beaches.

- > **PROTECTED BEACHES** 9th, 12th, 15th, 18th, 21st, 24th, 26th, 28th, 30th, 32nd, 35th, 38th, 40th, 43rd, 50th, 57th, 61st, 65th, 69th, 73rd, 76th and 79th streets
- > **RAFT BEACHES** 9th, 12th, 18th, 24th, 28th, 35th, 40th, 43rd, 50th, 61st, 69th, 73rd and 79th streets
- > **SURFING BEACHES** Either side of the 12th Street stand, 30th Street and 63rd Street, but not near bathers
- > **PADDLEBOARD BEACH** 63rd Street
- > Catamarans are not permitted.


BEACH CONDUCT

Picnicking on the beach is permitted. However, please place refuse in trash and in recycling containers. It is illegal to litter. Fires or any open flames, alcoholic beverages, bottles, glass, sharp objects, loud noise, indecent language or actions are strictly prohibited. No sleeping on the beach or boardwalk from sunset to sunrise. Trespassing on the dunes and in areas posted for endangered beach-nesting birds is strictly prohibited. Please use the paths provided.

RIP CURRENTS

Rip currents are powerful, narrow channels of fast-moving water that are prevalent in many bodies of water in the coastal United States, including in New Jersey. Panicked swimmers often try to counter a rip current by swimming straight back to shore — putting themselves at risk of drowning because of fatigue.

If you are caught in a rip current, don't fight it. Wave to shore for help. When rip currents are prevalent, the Avalon Beach Patrol may keep you closer to shore for your own safety.

Stay safe, only swim when and where a lifeguard is on duty

AVALON DUNE AND BEACH TRAIL

The Avalon Environmental Commission invites you to explore Avalon's dunes by walking our popular dune and beach trail. Explore our very diverse ecosystem in the high dunes and become educated about the environmental and protective value our dune system provides to the Borough. You can access the trail at 44th Street and 48th Street, on Dune Drive. Follow the interpretive signs, participate in the Kids' Corner, and be sure to bring your camera. OUR DUNES

Avalon has one of the only remaining high dune systems on the East Coast. Dune Walks, guided by Wetlands Institute staff, will be offered for \$3 on Wednesdays at 9:30am, June 13-Aug. 29, at the 48th Street dune path. Also, enjoy five miles of clean, wide beaches. Please stay on the beach path when going to the beach. It is prohibited for anyone to walk on the dunes; by Borough ordinance, fines may be imposed. Please help keep Avalon clean and green.

BEACH INFORMATION

BOARDWALK

Avalon has a half-mile boardwalk for your walking pleasure. Bicycles are permitted on the boardwalk only from 5-10am. Motorized bicycles, skateboards, roller skates, inline skates and mopeds are not permitted on the boardwalk at any time.

ACCESS TO BOARDWALKS AND BEACHES

- > Handicap ramps at 21st, 23rd, 24th, 25th, 26th, 27th, 29th, 30th, 32nd streets, and 8th and Avalon Avenue
- > Ramps to boardwalk and beach requiring companion's assistance: 22nd Street
- > Hard-packed gravel paths from street to beach are located at 9th to 20th, 32nd to 40th, 44th, 48th, 50th, and 57th to 79th streets
- > Accessible bay-front piers at 20th & 5th Avenue, 23rd, 33rd, 37th and 57th streets and 8th Street Pier at the bayside
- > All access to the beaches in Avalon are open in the interest of public safety. Due to storm events and beach erosion, at times access at a particular beach path may be closed until the beach or path is repaired.

PUBLIC RESTROOMS

Public restrooms are located: Borough Hall (32nd & Dune Drive), Public Safety Building (30th & Dune Drive), Community Hall (30th & the beach), Tennis Buildings (8th and 39th streets), 10th & Dune Drive, and 30th Street and the beach (next to the Tot Lot).

- > Tennis court at 8th Street is open May 24-Sept. 9, 7am-8pm daily.
- > Tennis court at 39th Street is open June 2-Sept. 9, 7am-6pm daily.
- > 30th Street Restroom is open March 31- Nov. 2, 9am-9pm daily.
- > 10th Street & Dune Drive: Winter season Jan. 1-April 27, and Nov. 3-Dec. 31, 10am-7pm.
- > 10th Street & Dune Drive: Summer season April 28-Nov. 2, 9am-9pm.

PUBLIC PARKING

Public parking is available in Borough lots at 32nd & Dune Drive behind the Municipal Building; 28th-30th streets and the beach; on the corner of 21st Street and 5th Avenue, and on 20th Street between Dune and Ocean Drives.

ACCESSIBLE PARKING

- > At 30th Street, adjacent to Community Hall (four spaces on north and south side of building)
- > At 32nd Street & the boardwalk (one space)
- > Parking lot at 29th Street & the boardwalk (four spaces)
- > Parking lot at 28th Street (four spaces)

BEACH INFORMATION

SURF CHAIRS

Locations:

- > 9th, 30th and 80th streets. *Reservations (no charge), call Beach Patrol at 609-967-7587 between 10am and 5pm; chairs cannot be reserved for more than one day at a time. Please refrain from using these chairs on the street.*

KAYAK PARK

Avalon's kayak park is located bayside at 57th Street and Ocean Drive. Kayaks may be launched any time of year by the public. Kayak storage on our seasonal racks is reserved for Avalon residents and property owners via a registration program during the first quarter of each year. No storage of kayaks, small boats, or any other objects is available on the grounds of the kayak park. Dog owners are asked to pick up after their pets by using bags available at the park. DOGS AND CATS

Dogs and cats must be licensed; an animal-control warden is employed by the Borough. **DOGS ARE PROHIBITED FROM BEING ON THE DUNES AT ANY TIME;** dogs are prohibited from being on the beach between March 1-Sept. 30. Dogs must be kept on a leash (when not confined) and their droppings must be retrieved immediately by the person in charge of the dogs.

Beach rules for wedding ceremony: no open flames, no temporary structures, no alcohol, no amplified music, no receptions (just the ceremony). AVALON SEAWATCH

Avalon is a premier destination for birders in the United States, Canada and Europe. In the middle of autumn, visitors to the north-end beaches may experience more than 30,000 birds flying over the beaches. Since 1993, the Avalon Seawatch Program, organized under the direction of the New Jersey Audubon Society and the Cape May Bird Observatory, has provided a dawn-to-dusk daily count from Sept. 22 to Dec. 22.

The Seawatch tallies the coastal migration of many southbound water birds including loons, grebes, cormorants, gannets, pelicans, ducks, herons and egrets, to name a few. The fall averages total almost 800,000 birds, but in some years, it approaches and even surpasses 1 million. More remarkable yet is that 70 percent of the migration, which includes more than 100 species, occurs during a five-week period (about Oct. 7 to Nov. 14). Double-crested cormorant, surf and black scoter, red-throated loon, and northern gannet are the most abundant species, accounting for more than 80 percent of the total flight.

The community is welcome to take advantage of the observatory post, located on the beach between 8th and 9th streets, after Labor Day weekend to document bird counts and species and take photographs. The Avalon Seawatch Program also provides real-time data on its website, njudubon.org/SectionResearch/AvalonSeaWatch.aspx.

PROTECT OUR MARINE ENVIRONMENT

Much of the pollution that is found in the ocean and bay begins as litter left on the beach, discarded from boats, or discarded on streets and sidewalks. Rain and storm water runs into storm drains that lead to our aquatic environment. The improper discarding of plastic products and the intentional release of balloons provides an inherent danger to marine life as these materials can entangle various species, or be digested by them. The Borough of Avalon provides numerous trash and recycling containers along our beaches and throughout our community. Please be mindful of our sensitive marine environment and properly dispose of plastics and other materials, and refrain from releasing balloons that may wind up in the bay or ocean.

BEACH-NESTING BIRDS

Two species of endangered nesting birds, piping plovers and least terns visit Avalon each summer to nest in the sand, between 40th and 58th streets. Certain areas will be posted as nesting begins and access will be prohibited. During the nesting season, there will be no beach raking March 15 through Aug. 31.

Some areas of wrack line (high-tide "grassy" line) may be left to provide a feeding area for chicks. Brochures about these birds are available at Community Hall (30th & the beach) or call a state wildlife biologist at 609-628-2103.

BICYCLE REGULATIONS



Avalon wants you to have a safe and enjoyable experience while bicycling in our community. Please be aware of the various state and borough regulations that all bicycling enthusiasts are obligated to follow. Avalon is proud to offer an expansion of the popular bicycle path that provides connectivity from the north end of our community south to 80th Street. With the support and encouragement of the Avalon Home and Land Owners Association, you can follow the new path and signage away from the downtown business district. For additional details, visit www.avalonboro.net and look for the page dedicated to safe bicycling in our community.

Borough ordinance requires you to walk, not ride, your bicycles on sidewalks in the Dune Drive business district, as riding bicycles on the sidewalks poses a safety hazard to riders and pedestrians. Bicyclists shall use the bicycle lane provided on portions of Dune Drive. Bicycles are permitted on the boardwalk in Avalon only between the hours of 5-10am. The State of New Jersey requires all bicycle riders under the age of 17 to wear a safety helmet. When bicycles are in use at nighttime, the state requires every bicycle to be equipped with a front headlamp emitting a white light visible from 500 feet to the front, and a rear lamp emitting a red light visible from a distance of at least 500 feet from the rear. All bicycles must be equipped with a bell or another audible device that can be heard at least 100 feet away, but not a siren or a whistle.

State law also requires the operator of a bicycle to ride as far to the right of the roadside as practicable, exercising due care when passing a standing vehicle or one proceeding in the same direction. In New Jersey, the law states a bicycle must obey all state and local automobile driving laws; a parent may be held responsible for the child's violation of any traffic law. Bicyclists shall ride in the same direction as vehicular traffic and shall never ride more than two abreast when traffic is not impeded.

ELECTRIC-VEHICLE CHARGING STATION



31st Street & Dune Drive

The Borough of Avalon offers an electric-vehicle charging station located in front of the Avalon Public Safety Building at 31st Street and Dune Drive. A dedicated parking spot for the charging station is available for any electric-vehicle owner to use at their convenience. Please follow all instructions on the electric-vehicle charging station to properly and safely charge your vehicle. If you have any questions, please call 866-480-2936.

TRAILER PARKING

Avalon is a barrier-island resort community where the population swells during the summer tourism months. The demand for on-street parking is further compounded by the fact that many nonresidents from surrounding mainland communities visit the borough on a daily basis to utilize the borough's beaches, marinas, athletic fields and other recreational and open-space facilities. This results in a heightened demand for seasonal parking.

The Borough of Avalon prohibits the parking of any trailer-type vehicle on any borough street on the Friday preceding Memorial Day weekend through Sept. 30 of any year. Boat and watercraft trailers shall not be parked on any borough street from June 1 through Sept. 30 of any year.

Construction tool trailers may be parked on any street, any time of year, at or near active construction sites, but only when the owner or lessee thereof is actively engaged in the construction process. Trailer-type vehicles that are making deliveries or providing a service to any residence or business may be parked temporarily for brief periods of time.

Avalon prohibits recreational trailer, camper, or similar vehicle to be placed in the street for use as a temporary or overnight dwelling or sleeping place.

AMERICAN LEGION STEPHEN C. LUDLAM POST 331

11625 Second Ave., Stone Harbor, 609-368-2294

Founded in 1945, American Legion Stephen C. Ludlam Post 331 represents veterans from all branches of the armed forces in Avalon and Stone Harbor. The Post, located at 11625 Second Ave. in Stone Harbor, occupies the oldest building in town, the Tatham Life Saving Station. It is dedicated to the memory of PFC Stephen C. Ludlam (1925-1945) of Stone Harbor, who was killed in action during World War II.

Members of the American Legion participate in numerous parades and ceremonies on Memorial Day and Veterans Day throughout the island and the Post hosts a Flag Day Ceremony each year. In addition, the members raise funds for the "Home for the Holidays" program, initiated to send members of the Coast Guard home over Thanksgiving and Christmas to see their families, at no expense.

FLAG DISPOSAL

In conjunction with the American Legion Post 331, the Borough of Avalon provides a flag-disposal receptacle at Borough Hall for the public to properly dispose of unserviceable American flags. Flags may be dropped in the receptacle during business hours, Monday through Friday, 8:15am to 4:15pm.

9/11 MEMORIAL PLAZA

21st Street & Dune Drive

The Borough of Avalon has an everlasting tribute to the victims and the first responders of the Sept. 11, 2001 attack on the United States. Avalon's 9/11 Memorial Plaza is located on Dune Drive at 21st Street, just north of Veterans Plaza. The Memorial Plaza's focal point is a 1,800-pound section of I-beam recovered from the site of the World Trade Center in New York. The artifact has a bend and compression point near the center, caused by either the collapse of the building or heat from the fire. The plaza also includes a walkway and a circular wall with bronze lettering that reads, "All that is good will endure ..." The plaza was financed through generous donations from the public, and was constructed by the Avalon Department of Public Works. The plaza was designed by the Taylor Design Group of Mount Laurel. In March 2013, the plaza received the "Excellence in Design" award from the New Jersey Recreation and Park Association.

A trip to Avalon is not complete without a visit to the Avalon History Center at 215 39th St. Take a journey through fascinating exhibits of yesteryear detailing the founding and facts of early Avalon. This promises to be an exciting year, featuring a new round of lectures and exhibit displays.

Summer programming will feature a three-part lecture series covering Avalon's "railroad age" from 1888-1939; the wartime years through 1962 when a powerful storm changed the island's history; and the recent years, characterized by new businesses, development and shifting demographics.

In addition to the lecture series, the Avalon History Center will continue with popular programming including Trivia Night, Tea Time, the annual Clamshell Pitch Tournament, and dedicated children's programming.

Exhibits slated for 2018 include the opening of a display focusing on Avalon's sports teams and grade-school classes from past decades. An extension of a current exhibit featuring the Avalon Beach Patrol will focus on the experience of female guards through the years. And finally, a third exhibit is planned, celebrating the 50th anniversary of the Avalon Players, a local children's theater group.

SPORT FISHING CENTER



14th Street & Ocean Drive, 609-967-5917

The Borough of Avalon operates a Sport Fishing Center bayside located at 14th Street and Ocean Drive. Seasonal dock slips are available at the center for motorized boats only; no kayaks, canoes, sail craft or personal watercraft can apply for seasonal dock slips. A season-permit fee rate is established annually between March 15 and Dec. 15 for which an application may be applied for each dock slip. Boats must be rigged for sport fishing. Permitting is conducted by the Avalon Office of Administration. Please call 609-967-5917. At the present time, there is a waiting list for a slip.

FISHING TOURNAMENT

TRASH AND RECYCLABLES are to be placed curbside by 7am. Trash and recycling will not be collected on these holidays: Thanksgiving, Christmas Day and New Year's Day. By ordinance the following container sizes may be used:

- 5 containers not to exceed 35-gallon capacity and not to exceed 50 pounds each; OR
- 5 containers not to exceed 40-gallon capacity each; OR
- 4 containers not to exceed 50-gallon capacity each; OR
- 3 containers not to exceed 65-gallon capacity each; OR
- 2 containers not to exceed 96-gallon capacity.

THERE IS NO LIMIT OF THE PREVIOUSLY MENTIONED SIZED CONTAINERS FOR RECYCLING ONLY. Containers from 35-to-96-gallon capacities shall be used only if such receptacles or containers are of the roll-out type and suitably equipped and capable of being serviced by collection vehicles which are equipped with tipper/kicker arms.

As a courtesy, **PLEASE DO NOT** put cans in the street. No bulk items (household furnishings, construction materials) will be collected with trash.

BRUSH & GRASS CLIPPINGS must be loose inside of a container with lid and marked YARD WASTE. Pickup will be on Thursdays. Use of plastic bags or paper bags for clippings is prohibited. When cleaning up leaves or grass, do not put them in the street.

WHITE GOODS/METAL/RIGID PLASTIC AND ELECTRONICS shall be scheduled for a pickup on Fridays by calling Public Works at 609-967-7697.

SINGLE-STREAM IS MANDATORY Please recycle (a) all newspapers with inserts, magazines, junk mail, cardboard, office paper, shoe, cereal and food boxes together with (b) all rinsed glass bottles and jars, aluminum and tin cans, and household plastic bags with a 1 through 7 on the bottom of the container(s). Use of plastic bags for recycling is strictly prohibited, except for shredded paper, which must be placed in clear plastic bags.




